## Here Is How We Improved the Health & Well-Being of the Greater Phoenixville Area in FY 11

The **DENTAL PROGRAM** helped 107 children and 584 adults receive dental care at our 17 dedicated dental providers. Some people need routine cleanings and exams while others come to us with dental emergencies. Unfortunately the cost of dental care is out of reach for many who are struggling with un-employment and just trying to support their families. Children are eligible to re-apply to the program every six months while adults can re-apply annually.

If you have no insurance and have been referred to an orthopedic specialist, it is very difficult to schedule an appointment without money (\$200) up front. That is why

our **EMERGENCY ORTHOPEDIC PROGRAM** was established. We helped 16 individuals with injuries to ankles, wrists, feet, legs and knees. They were all seen by our participating Orthopedic practice and treated in the office for their injury.

The **PRESCRIPTION PROGRAM** helps over 250 people obtain medications on an ongoing basis from the drug company's Patient Assistance Programs (PAPs). 122 new clients were assisted with PAPs and another 114 clients received help with emergency supplies of medications. We network with local physicians on behalf of our clients and two local pharmacies provide a discount to our program for medications.

With the assistance of our 8 providers, the **VISION PROGRAM** helped 403 children and adults receive eye exams and/or glasses. Most clients come to us for routine vision care, however we've helped those with eye injuries see the eye doctor the same day avoiding a visit to the hospital emergency room.

PHCAF recently took over the administration of the Community **MAMMOGRAM PROGRAM**. Free routine and diagnostic mammograms are provided through a partnership with Phoenixville Hospital, Community Radiology and PHCAF.

### “Standards for Excellence” continue to be met by PHCAF

Phoenixville Healthcare Access Foundation (PHCAF) is proud to display this seal of Excellence awarded by the Pennsylvania Association of Nonprofit Organizations. PHCAF was awarded certification under the Standards for Excellence program, which is bestowed only to the most well-managed and responsibly governed nonprofit organizations that have demonstrated compliance with 56 specific *Standards*

*For Excellence* based on honesty, integrity, fairness, respect, trust, responsibility, and accountability. PHCAF has met, complied with, and integrated the Standards for Excellence into all its activities to successfully complete this voluntary certification program. PHCAF was first awarded this Seal of Excellence in June of 2009. Re-certification for the next five years is being submitted at the time of this publication.

Working with the nurse, PHCAF was able to assist the family with a visit at a local Orthopaedic specialist, and the girl was **seen and casted immediately.**
